


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Report: Activity-01

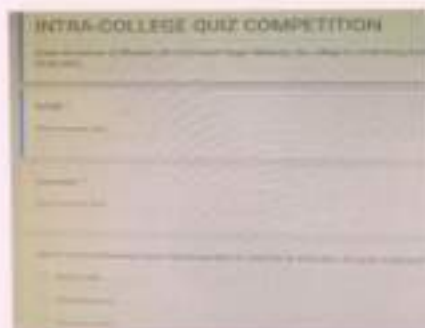


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Report: Activity-05

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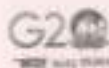
Activity No 04: Visit to Public Library

Introduction: Wetlands are highly productive and biologically diverse systems that enhance water quality, control erosion, maintain stream flows, sequester carbon, and provide a home to at least one-third of all threatened and endangered species. In order to protect these fragile systems, Ramsar convention was formed. Ramsar Convention is the intergovernmental treaty that provides the framework for the conservation and wise use of wetlands and their resources. The Convention was adopted in the Iranian city of Ramsar in 1971 and came into force in 1975. Since then, almost 90% of UN member states, from all the world's geographic regions, have acceded to become "Contracting Parties". World Wetlands Day, celebrated annually on 2 February, aims to raise global awareness about the vital role of wetlands for people and planet. This day also marks the date of the adoption of the Convention on Wetlands on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar.

In order to mark the celebration on Wetland Day (2 February 2024), Department of Environmental Sciences organized one-week awareness programme on Wetlands. Dr. Ishiyaq Ahmed Najat, Assistant Professor Environmental Sciences gave a brief introduction about the programme and its different events. The programme was started with the screening of documentary on Wetlands.

The documentary begins by stating that Wetlands are productive ecosystems that play an essential role in hydrological cycles. The presence of wetlands can have an impact on storms and floods, clean water supplies and provide food and fiber and recreational benefits. Many wetlands provide habitat for other important faunal components, serving as resting and feeding stations along migratory flyways for ducks, waders and shorebirds, which benefit from the diversity of food organisms. Wetlands can, however, be vulnerable to land use and but restoring them is not a difficult task. Wetlands need to be allowed to flow naturally to benefit their surroundings and the populations dependent on them. The film concludes by encouraging people to do what they can to help protect and restore wetlands.



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Day 2: 02.02.2024 (field trip to Hokersar Wetland)

On 02.02.2024, field trip to Hokersar Wetland was arranged by Wildlife Warden, Wetland Division Kashmir, so that students have firsthand experience on wetlands. The Hokersar Wetland is located in Zainakote area of Srinagar city. It is known as Queen of Wetlands for its immense ecological values and is an important refuge for migratory waterfowls, shorebirds and trans-Himalayan bird species during winter. During the trip students visited different migratory bird viewing/roosting sites.

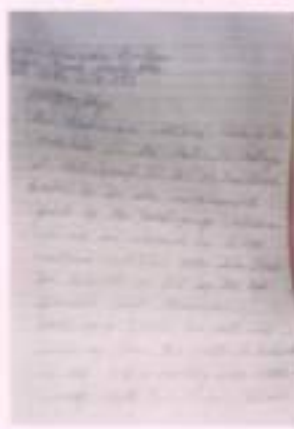

Day 4: 04.02.2024 (Essay competition)

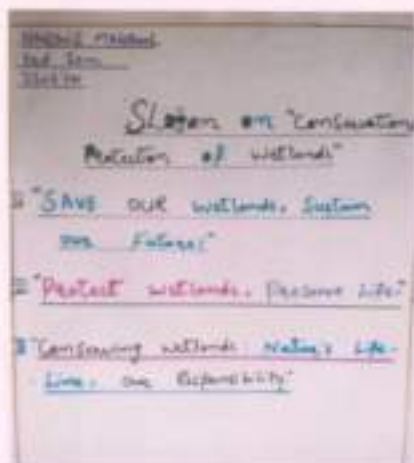

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Day 5: 05.02.2024 (Slogan writing competition)

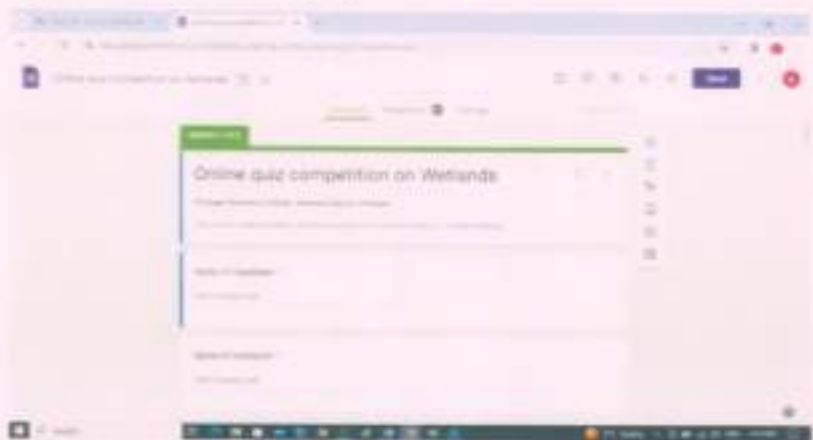
